California Proposition 65 Substances

As part of Electromagnetic Industries' product stewardship, we continuously monitor the safety, health, and environmental regulations' impact on the usage of products we manufacture.

California's Proposition 65, the California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, entitles California consumers to special warnings for products that contain chemicals known to the state of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm if those products expose consumers to such chemicals above certain threshold levels.

This document certifies that, to the best of current knowledge and belief and under normal usage, Electromagnetic Industries' products are in compliance with California Proposition 65. Although some of our products may contain chemicals restricted by California Proposition 65, there is no risk of exposure, such as through skin contact, through ingestion with food/drink, or through inhalation during normal usage.

Electromagnetic Industries' products contain No Significant Risk Levels (NSRLs) for cancer-causing chemicals and are below the Maximum Allowable Dose Levels (MADLs) for chemicals causing reproductive toxicity. Therefore, a warning label that our products contain compounds that may cause cancer, birth defects, or reproductive harm is not required.

Please note that for people or companies intending to use Electromagnetic Industries' products outside of normal, intended usage, such as through destructive decomposition, there may be a potential risk for exposure to Proposition 65 chemicals if contained in the product. To reduce risk of exposure, work with approved safety equipment in a well-ventilated area, wear dust masks that are specially designed to filter out microscopic particles, wear protective gloves and wash hands after handling.
